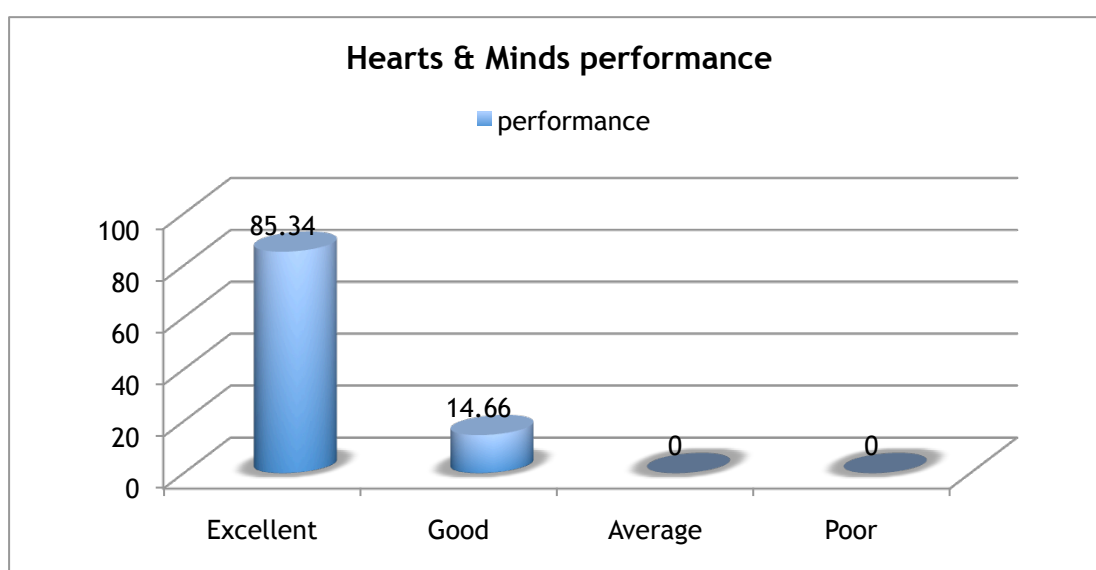

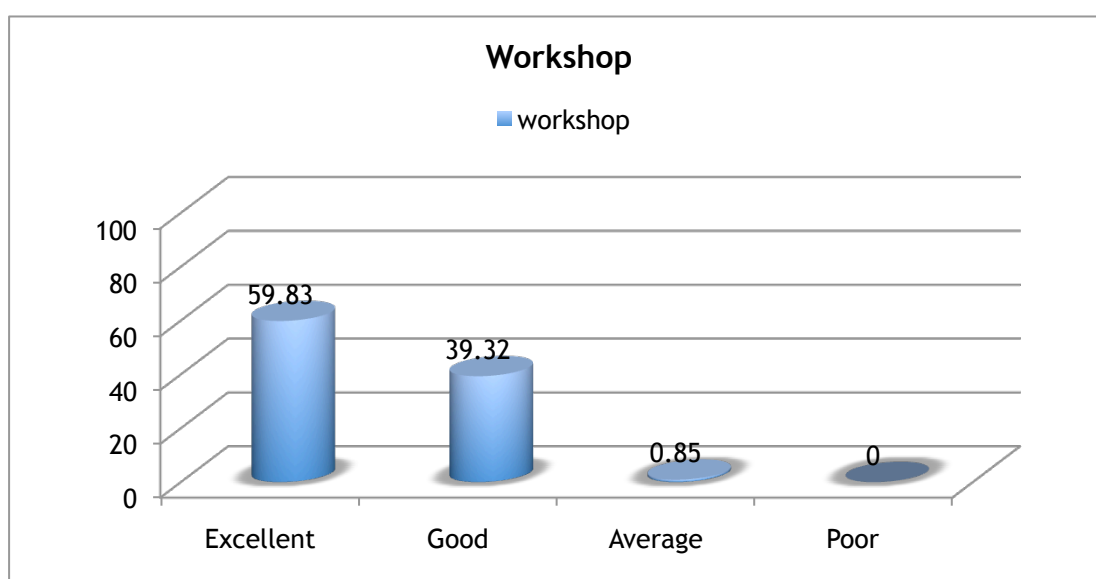

Responses to the workshop (calculated as percentage):



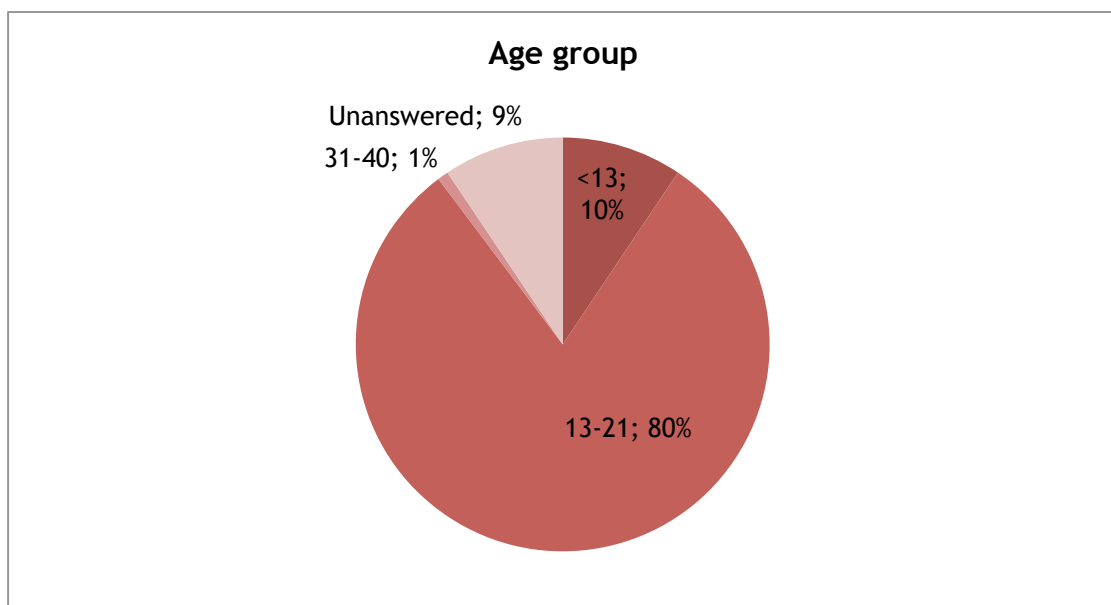
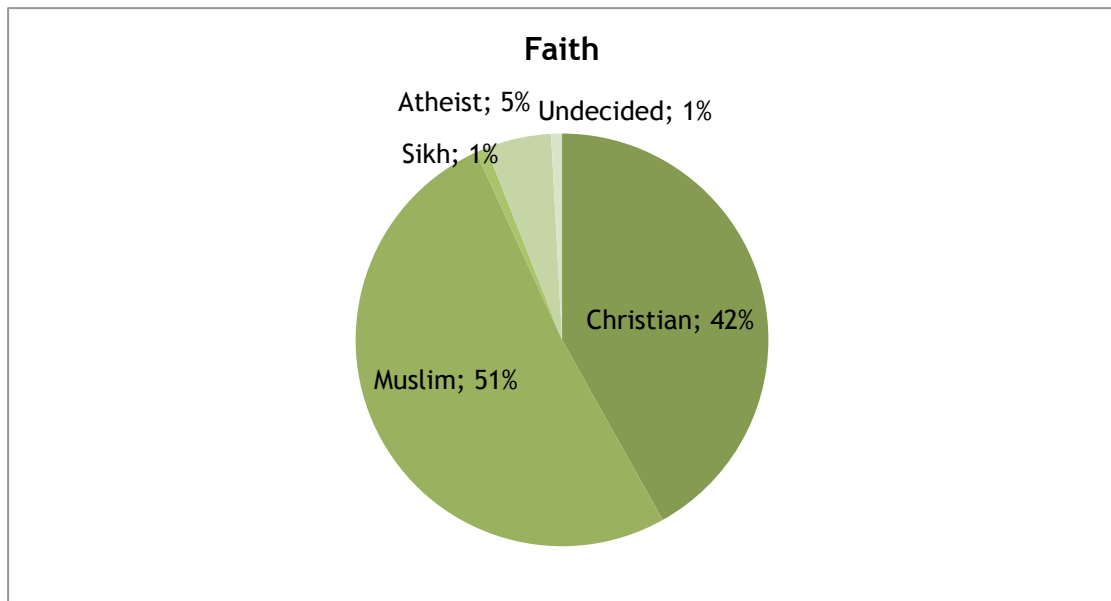
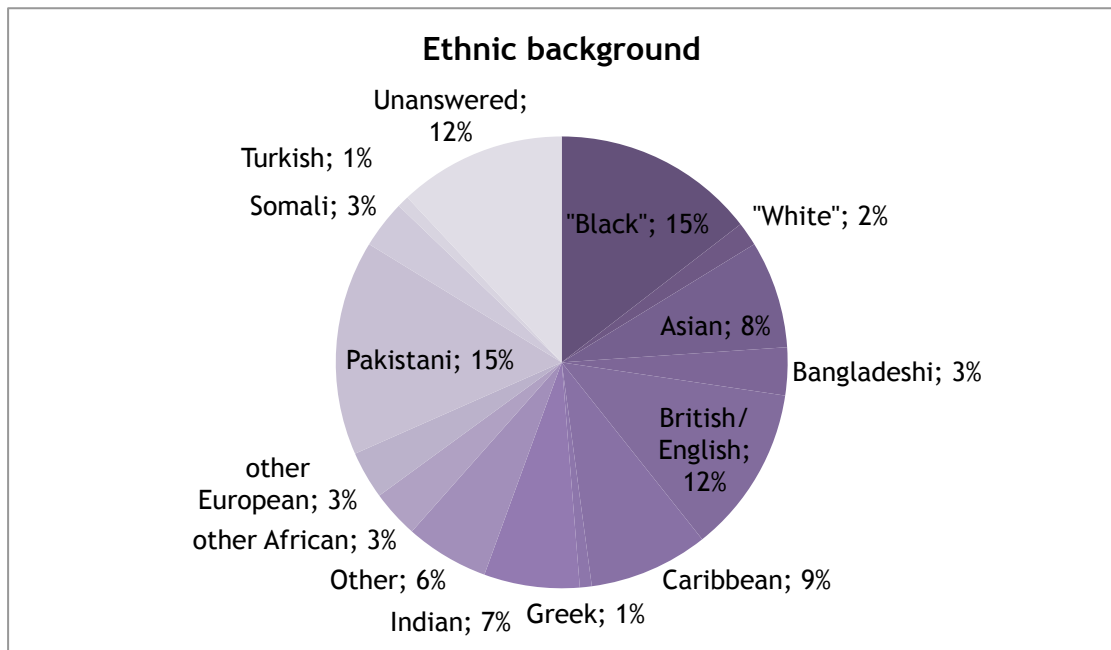
