Dear Parents/Carers.

I hope this letter finds you and your families well; a Friday update for you as always. As the days continue to get longer and move towards summer equinox next week, the positive is that the school has been purposeful and hardworking! On a less positive note, you may be aware that unfortunately, this week saw some disruption due to fire alarms. The school has followed up these incidents with appropriate sanctions for the perpetrators. We have also held year group assemblies, and Leyton fire service has delivered an assembly for year 9 and 10 assemblies focused on hoax fire alarms and their negative consequences, consisting of but not limited to:

- Emergency services are diverted away from real emergencies, which increases response times and puts other people's health and safety at risk, including those working in the fire service
- People can get hurt in unnecessary evacuations
- Those who repeatedly face false alarms may become complacent, putting everyone at risk if a real fire occurs
- They disrupt learning and teaching, which has an impact on students' education
- They can cause anxiety for others

Students have also been reminded of the following:

- Setting off a hoax alarm is a criminal offence
- It is also a breach of Connaught School For Girls' behaviour policy as it endangers the safety of others and brings the school into disrepute, and hence will be sanctioned
- They should report any suspicious behaviour to a staff member
- Always treat every alarm as real leave the building quickly and calmly
- We all play a role in keeping our school safe

Free school meal eligibility

I was pleased to note the recent positive news that more families will soon be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) under the expanded criteria, including those receiving Universal Credit. This change means that a greater number of children will have access to a nutritious meal each day, helping to support concentration, well-being and academic progress. It also ensures that more families facing financial challenges can benefit from this vital support, easing some of the pressures caused by the current cost of living. We welcome this move and the potential it has to positively impact students both in and out of the classroom. 
Exploring the Future: Inspiring Assembly on Universities and Degree Apprenticeships

Importantly, this session also highlighted that university is not the only pathway to a successful career. Apprenticeships were discussed in depth, helping students understand how they can provide equally rewarding and meaningful opportunities.

This engaging session allowed students to reflect on the various routes available to them after school, from university degrees to hands-on apprenticeships. It was a brilliant chance to learn more about potential career options and the benefits of both academic and vocational paths. The Year 9 students were grateful to our guest speakers for sharing their stories and inspiring our students to think more deeply about their futures.

She spoke passionately about how apprenticeships offer the perfect balance between gaining real-world work experience and continuing academic study. Her story highlighted the exciting opportunities and career paths that can be pursued through this route.

As we heard about T Levels, we discovered that while they share similarities with apprenticeships—such as combining practical experience with learning—they also offer unique structures and benefits. It was eye-opening to understand the differences and consider which path might suit our individual goals and interests.

Overall, this assembly encouraged us to think deeply about our futures and reminded us that there are many routes to success. It inspired us to keep an open mind, follow our passions, and to never give up—whatever path we choose.

Work Experience
