# International Day of the Girl – Global Girl Leading Summit - Friday 10th October

As many of you know, Connaught continues to work in partnership with Mulberry School for Girls on a number of exciting projects that have carried into this academic year. Among these are the Applied Stories Project: For Our Mothers Poetry Competition and Magic Me Film Project, based on working with older women in the community to create an Intergenerational Film. Both of these events have provided incredible opportunities for our students to engage

creatively and reflectively beyond the classroom.

As a result of these inspiring extracurricular programmes, both groups were invited to attend the **Global Girl Leading Conference** on **Friday 10th October 2025**. This annual event, hosted at Mulberry School for Girls, was first established in 2016 following a visit from Michelle Obama. Together, Mulberry and Mrs. Obama's foundation created a leadership programme "for girls, by girls," with the aim of empowering young women across the globe to become confident, compassionate leaders.

The conference was streamed live around the world, and we were thrilled to share the experience with schools from India, the United States, Australia, Kenya, Mexico and many more, to name just a few. Throughout the day, delegates heard from a range of inspirational speakers, including **Tina Tchen**—a Chinese-American Lawyer and former White House staff member who was first lady to Michelle Obama r—and the remarkable **Dr Edna Adan Ismail**, aged 88, a nurse, midwife, activist, and the first female Foreign Minister of Somaliland. Dr Ismail's story, from surviving FGM to building a hospital and leading international campaigns against the practice, moved and motivated everyone present. Her lifelong dedication to justice and women's health was a powerful reminder of the impact one determined individual can have.

In addition to the keynote sessions, attendees took part in leadership workshops that encouraged public speaking, collaboration, and the sharing of ideas across cultures and communities.

We were especially proud of how **Connaught** was represented at the summit.

- **Penelope Benito (Year 10)** also took to the stage to present the group's short film created through *Magic Me*. A heartfelt ten-minute piece that celebrated intergenerational connection and the sharing of stories across generations.

The **Global Girl Leading Conference** was far more than a day of talks and workshops. It was truly a **celebration of girlhood**. Taking place on the "International Day of the Girl," The event reminded us of the power of shared voices and the strength found in unity. Sitting among passionate, ambitious young women from around the world was a humbling and uplifting experience.

As one speaker, Tina Tchen, reflected: "I think I was a little bit audacious when I was younger." It is that very audacity - the courage to dream boldly and act with purpose - that drives change.

As we continue our partnership with Mulberry, we carry forward these stories, experiences, and connections. They remind us that leadership is not only about being in charge, but about lifting each other up, sharing our truths, and creating spaces "where every girl can lead".
