- 1.10pm for KS4 students

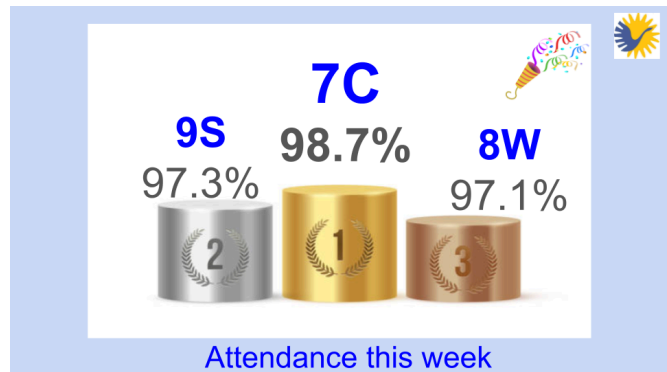
We look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 5th January at the normal school time.

We're pleased to report that 91 Year 11 students attended a screening of 'A Christmas Karma' this week to enhance their understanding of Charles Dickens' classic novella, 'A Christmas Carol', which they are studying for their GCSE English Literature paper 2 examination. This modern adaptation



provided students with a fresh perspective on the timeless themes of redemption, social responsibility, and the consequences of our actions. By experiencing a diverse retelling of Scrooge's transformation, students were able to explore how Dickens' Victorian social commentary remains relevant today, whilst deepening their analysis of key characters, themes, and narrative structure. The film offered an excellent opportunity for students to consider different interpretations of the text and will undoubtedly support their critical thinking and essay-writing skills as they prepare for their summer examinations in 2026.
